Table Tennis Championship

28 May – 13 June 2011

PLAYERS

At the Table Tennis Championship can be registered members of the diplomatic corps and administrative personnel assigned in Bucharest, as well as Romanian diplomats and administrative personnel. Their family members are allowed to participate into the competition;

The table tennis championship is structured as follow: women's, men's and double competition. As far as the doubles competition is concerned, there is no nationality or sex constraint in the making up of the teams.

GENERAL RULES

Eliminatory system - 2 games out of 3. The final match is played 3 out of 5 games.

If it is raining during the match, either player may decide to call a halt to the match, but the match must still be completed.

If a player wants to reschedule a match – he/ she must give his or her opponent a minimum of 24 hours notice. If the notice is given less than 24 hours the match may be recorded as a walkover in favor of the opponent (although it is still preferable to play the match if possible). In either of these two cases, the organizer must be informed as soon as possible. In case of withdrawal after the drawing lots, the concerned players are disqualified and the opponent/s is/are declared qualified for the next round. Players can not agree to play their match AFTER the round has ended. The player who cannot play the match when the round is scheduled will be considered forfeiting the match. In any of the above mentioned cases referee's and/or organiser's decision is final.

Table tennis rules

For each game, the first player to reach 11 points wins that game, however a game must be won by at least a two point margin.

The edges of the table are part of the legal table surface, but not the sides.

The order of the play

Each player serves two points in a row and then switch server. However, if a score of 10-10 is reached in any game, then each server serves only one point and then the server is switched. After each game, the players switch side of the table.

For double competition, the server shall first make a good service, the receiver shall then make a good return, the partner of the server shall then make a good return, the partner of the receiver shall then make a good return and thereafter each player in turn in that sequence shall make a good return.

The ball must rest on an open hand palm. Then it must be tossed up at least 6 inches and struck so the ball first bounces on the server's side and then the opponent's side. If the serve is legal except that it touches the net, it is called a let serve. Let serves are not scored and are reserved.

REGISTRATIONS

The registration is possible by E – mail only.

*The registration period starts on April 28, 2011 and ends on May 20, 2011, 17.00h.
The competition starts on May 28, 2011 and ends June 13, 2011.
No late registration will be accepted.*

The drawing lots will be conducted in a public manner on May 24th, 2011, at the MFA.
